SENATOR BEUTLER PRFSIDING

SENATOR BEUTLER: There are no further lights, Senator Wickersham. Do you care to close on your amendment? Closing is waived. The motion before you is the adoption of the Wickersham amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please vote. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, on the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The amendment has been adopted. Is there further discussion? There are no further lights, Senator Wickersham. Would you like to close on the advancement of the bill?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. President, I would...on behalf of Senator Raikes, I would waive closing.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Closing is waived. The question before you is the advancement of LB 1104. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.
