PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 1266. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 1266.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 1266 advances. Mr. Clerk, items for the record.

CLERK: Thank you, Madam President. Enrollment and Review reports (LB) 465, (LB) 1321, and (LB) 1321A to Select File. Amendments to be printed: Senator Beutler to (LB) 922; Senator Abboud to (LR) 303CA; Senator Wickersham to (LB) 1104; Senator Bohlke to (LB) 1104; and Senator Willhoft to (LB) 1219. Communication from the Governor to the Clerk. (Read communication re LB 204, LB 204A, and LB 1173.) That's all that I have, Madam President. Thank you. PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We now turn to LB 218.

CLERK: Madam President, 218 on General File, introduced originally by Senator Maurstad. (Read brief description.) Introduced in January of last year, at that time was referred to the Judiciary Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have an amendment pending to the bill by Senator Maurstad, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Chair recognizes Senator Maurstad to open.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Thank you, Madam President. First of all, I'm sure everyone is aware but I'd like to point out that this is the 49th senator priority bill so I'd like to take this opportunity to commend the Speaker for working the agenda in a manner in which all senator priority bills have been able to be heard on General File. As most of you are probably aware, LB 218 originally would have changed the penalties associated with fleeing to avoid arrest. This was a bill that was originally introduced by Senator Lindsay when he was still Chairman of the Judiciary Committee, that when he left the Legislature I introduced at the beginning of last year.
