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SENATOR JENSEN: The Secretary of State is going to work that out with the counties. We did...there is an A bill with this that will fund some of that.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So that is subject to negotiation, but assuming much of the cost to the county should go away, could I interpret it that way?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, the costs should go away.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And may these computers be used for purposes other than UCC searches?

SENATOR JENSEN: I think that...that's an issue that again should be worked out between the counties and the Secretary of State. Certainly if that computer is there, it would seem to me that if something jointly could be worked out between the state and the counties, I think it should be used, as long as it is always available for these filings.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That leads me to another question that's not here, what about replacement computers?

SENATOR JENSEN: I really...I really don't know, Senator, about the replacement and what is the life of a computer. The life really doesn't change, it's the hardware and certainly the electronic advances is what really changes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I have to say here, though, based on my experience here, the life of those computers gets shorter and shorter.

SENATOR JENSEN: I have a couple of those computers that turned out to be fish weights.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, it'd appear to me that if it is going to be state run that the county obligation here should become less and less, even to the point of not having to make those replacements, if they are not going to have much control over them.
