CLERK: (Read LB 1162A on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1162A pass? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1920 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 1 nay, 3 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 1162A passes. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do hereby sign Legislative Bills 1209, 1209A, 1193, 1193A, 1070, 1070A, 1063, 1063A, 59, 922, 1162, 1162A and Legislative Resolutions 45CA, 47S and 480.

Mr. Clerk, we now turn to motions to override gubernatorial vetoes.

CLERK: Madam President, Legislative Bill 1108, with certain line-item reductions by the Governor. First motion I have is from the Appropriations Committee. Senator Wehrbein, your motion and the accompanying information sheets are found on page 1825 of the Journal, involves Section 36, Developmental Disability Aid; and Section 57, Miscellaneous Improvements to Facilities.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Wehrbein to open on the motion.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Madam Speaker, members of the body, the Appropriations Committee recommended two, I have those that I passed out yesterday, and it's a long sheet telling about Governor vetoes and committee recommended overrides. The committee recommended two of which I will discuss briefly here. If there's questions, it's on the developmental disabilities rate equity issue. This the Governor vetoed out some of the increase in the minimum, excuse me, in the disability service will be increased to a minimum of 85 percent in '97-98 and 90 percent in 1998-99.
