SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Cudaback, you're recognized to close on your motion to override.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I think we understand the bill so, Senator Kristensen and everybody, and let's just vote it up or down. Appreciate your support.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is, shall LB 695A pass notwithstanding the objections of the Governor? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. There's been a request for a roll call vote. Senator Cudaback, for what point do you rise? Senator Cudaback has made a request to place the house under call. All those of placing...all those in favor of placing the house under call vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 40 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: House is under call. Members, please check in. Senator Matzke, would you check in, please? Thank you. Mr. Clerk, roll call vote.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1924 of the Legislative Journal.) 35 ayes, 7 nays on the override, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The override is successful. LB 695A becomes law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor. The call is raised. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wickersham would move that Legislative Bill 1120 become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wickersham, you're recognized to open.
