Thank you. Senator Dwite Pedersen, would you check in, please? Senator Beutler, would you check in? Senator Suttle, the house is under call. Senator Suttle, the house is under call. Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. Speaker, I'll also request a roll call vote in reverse order, reverse.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: All members are present. The question before the body is, shall LB 1120 pass notwithstanding the objections of the Governor? There's been a request for a reverse order roll call by Senator Wickersham. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1925 of the Legislative Journal.) 32 ayes, 9 nays on the motion to override the Governor's veto.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The override is successful. LB 1120 becomes law notwithstanding the objection of the Governor. The call is raised. Next item.

CLERK: Senator Wickersham would move that Legislative Bill 1120A become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wickersham to open.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I scarcely know where to begin, I'm so pleased with that last vote. Obviously, the A bill is the funding for the primary bill that you've just approved. I cannot do anything more than just ask for your support for the A bill. It is...I...I...I don't know quite how to tell you how grateful I am for your last vote.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I only have three words to say with reference to what the body is doing--spend, spend, spend.
