SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: No, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Closing is waived. The question before you is the adoption of LR 482. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of 482.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LR 482 is adopted. Senator Preister announces that the following guests are visiting the Legislature. There are 20 fourth graders here from Karen Western Elementary in Omaha, with their teacher. They are seated in the north balcony. Will you all stand up and be recognized please. The Chair recognizes Senator Hilgert for a point of personal privilege.

SENATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Madam President and members. I just wanted to express my wife's and my appreciation for the well wishes and the congratulations on the birth of our first child. The name is John Linden. "Linden" is my wife's maiden name. For some of those who are wondering if I named it after our former president, I did not. It is spelled L-i-n-d-e-n. We were going to name him "Tax Cut", but I didn't think Bob Wickersham would go for it. But, just kidding, but anyway I do appreciate all the well wishes that we've received and thank you very much.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Hilgert. We are on Final Reading. If senators will please return to your seats, we're on Final Reading. Senators, if you will please be seated.
