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also...it would make numerous changes on the appointment process, changing that from a council to a mayor portion, and you can debate that, whether or not that's good or bad. I...it's whether or not you believe in the mayor being more actively involved in the system or not. My belief is that we have to look institutionally and find the best approach in dealing with these appointments and, the way we allow for appointments in the city, it's predominantly through the mayoral system. And, in addition, as I said, the city council is directly involved in how this money should be spent, so you may have a proposal that never sees the light of day because of these individuals that are appointed. I'm a firm believer that elected officials should be the ones making the ultimate decisions and, with that in mind, the committee made changes to provide that the board does not have the complete decision-making authority but, rather, we brought the elected officials in to a greater degree, but not to an extent that I felt was adequate. Now if a board makes a denial on a particular grant, there is no other recourse. They can't bring that up before the city council and say, we feel that this is an excellent grant. Even if the city council and the mayor is in agreement, if it's not proposed the council cannot bring it before us...bring it before themselves to consider. I feel that this is not a good way to be having legislation enacted and, for that reason, I'm going to be opposing the bill. Now there's also a second issue that I think raises the issue of whether or not, in a letter that was sent out by the Legal Department from the city of Omaha from Jo Cavel, there's language that provides under subsection (7) of the bill that the approval...that to approve the acceptance by the city of any state or federal grant or loan for enterprise zone, and it's their interpretation that this should be broadly interpreted that it was...the language itself was not good language in the fact that it provides that the enterprise zone would have the authority to reject all grants or make a decision on all grants that come from the federal government because of the language in the legislation. I felt that this language probably should have been tightened up. It's one of those bills, as we just saw with the bill that just was enacted, probably should have been taken care of on Select File. It was not. The only other option really is to stop the legislation and not to enact this piece of legislation. I'm going to leave the motion up on...up before the body and
