those two situations are consistent with this kind of discretion. I would be happy to recognize those. So those problems are solved without getting them into the law. Funds received by an executive department, state institution, board, or officer for a good or service which may or may not be delivered contingent upon a selection process shall not be subject to this section. What does that mean? We have at least two places where we ask people to send us checks and we don't cash them. One of them is Game and Parks licenses for a certain kind of thing, and I'm not sure whether it is like a deer license or something, but there are a limited number of licenses that are sold and we get twice or three times that amount of people who send us checks. We don't want to put those checks in the bank and then send refunds. Stop me, that costs a lot of money, but we want to hold those checks. So where there is a selection process, this kicks in at the point in which the selection is made, and we've identified the 200 people that are going to get the deer licenses or the 1,000 people that are going to get the tickets for the special postseason game from the football team, and we are going to send back the 5,000 checks from people who didn't win the lottery. We are not going to put them all in the bank, and we are not going to send refunds, in those selection processes where we don't know whether we want to cash the check or not, we simply hold the check and then we're going to put the check in the bank in three days, once we know that these are checks that we're going to put into the bank. We do indicate, we clear up a little bit in the enforcement area. It says: The failure or refusal of an employee of an executive department to pay under this section shall be prima facie evidence of embezzlement. It actually is a narrowing of the kind of application of the enforcement provision in 84-711. With those amendments, the university was satisfied that they could live with this and they have removed their objection. Understand that there is at least the exchange of letters that should occur on an informal basis that we contemplate as a second track to this discussion. I would ask for the adoption of the amendment. I would ask for the advancement of the bill. In the event, you can get a million dollars into the bank a day early, you save yourself a thousand, five hundred bucks in interest. The projected monetary benefit of this bill is some place between 750,000 to 1,250,000, and although it would be hard to identify those in hard figures, the
