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goal of simply using our money better and getting a million bucks of interest is a pretty attractive idea, particularly when we are changing a standard that was pre-fax machine, pre-computers, pre-wire transfers, and that we have the technology now to transfer money simply by electronic impulse, and we can live with this, it seems to me. I would ask for the advancement of LB 61.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Landis. Committee amendments, there are committee amendments. Senator Schimek, to open on the committee amendments. (See AM0103 on page 385 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Madam Chairman and members of the body. I just rise in support of AM0103, and I don't believe I could improve upon or embellish or in any way contribute as far as explanation of the committee amendments, which Senator Landis has explained in total, and has explained very well. I do believe that the people who did express concerns at the committee hearing have been taken care of with this amendment, and I think that we addressed every concern that was raised at the hearing. So unless there are questions on the committee amendment, I would simply urge its adoption.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Discussion on the committee amendments? Senator Dwite Pedersen. He wants to speak on the bill. Any further discussion on the committee amendments? Seeing none, Senator Schimek, do you want to close on the amendments? She waives closing on the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.
