Again, very simply, I hope you all visualize when I was talking about what the courts deem as punishment and what caregivers are subjected to day in and day out, and the fact that we're not talking about creating a wheel here. We're talking about utilizing agencies that are already in place in many instances, funding streams that are already there that people don't know how to access. And so, please, I ask for your careful consideration of this legislation. It is meaningful to every single one of us in this body and all of the constituents we represent. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. The question before us is the advancement of LB 148 to E & R Initial. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 148.

Committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 20, (LB) 20A, LB 61, (LB) 66, (LB) 66A, (LB) 77, (LB) 168, (LB) 195, (LB) 202, (LB) 202A, (LB) 227, (LB) 317, and LR 10CA as correctly engrossed. I have a series of hearing notices from the Business and Labor Committee, all signed by Senator Vrtiska. And, Mr. President, appointment letters from the Governor to the Power Review Board, Crime (sic--Climate) Assessment Response Committee, Office of Juvenile Services, Director of Banking, and Director of Revenue.
