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extract my time on General File, on Select File, and on Final Reading, should it get that far. And the body is perfectly at liberty to determine that this is an issue of such great importance, of such moment that it justifies the expenditure of that time. And so that I can tip the rest of you off...you all off and you can be prepared, I've got transcripts from various hearings, and I'm going to read comments from my colleagues expressing concerns about their area and their constituents. I am going to, especially at this time, deal with some testimony we had before the Agriculture Committee because I was there and heard it. And when I decide to launch into that later on in the morning, I am going to begin with the presentation of "Deacon" Jones. I had never seen him come before a committee with such passion, if you want to call it that. He was concerned about his constituents. That's the way we're supposed to be, I presume, but my concern is extended to other people's constituents including those of Senator Jones. So I'm going to take my time on this bill. I will continue to talk about the issues that boil between black people, other minority groups in Omaha, particularly Latinos.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: In fact, in Senator Hilgert's district, last summer or the summer before, there was a police chase through one of their neighborhoods and a kid got run over, and the cop involved in the chase had turned off the cruiser's camera. When they are in chases, they are supposed to leave that camera on. He turned it off, so there is no record from the camera, but there were reports in the paper about the kid being run over. And, thanks to a law that I got the Legislature to pass, that child and that child's family will be compensated by the city of Omaha for any injuries because that child was an innocent third party hurt in an Omaha Police chase. People benefit from the laws that I get through this Legislature through the expenditure of sweat and blood, no tears, and then they benefit from it and their colleagues and their constituents. But in the process of hammering these things out, I run into the stone walls like I am doing here on this bill.
