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CLERK: Yours is 1001.

SENATOR KIEL: One thousand one? Okay.

CLERK: "Intent of the Legislature...the License Act be revenue neutral."

SENATOR KIEL: Oh, thank you. We weren't sure where that was going to go in. The purpose of this amendment is to provide that if this bill passes and this fund that we're going to create in which the fees for getting a handgun permit are going to go into would require that, should at some point the money be used up in the fund, that no more concealed handgun permits should be issued, until there is money again in the fund. In other words, I want this to remain completely revenue neutral, and that the state would not use any kind of money to, of its own, either General Fund appropriation, or from anywhere else, any agency, to provide funding to continue to issue concealed handgun permits, until such time as there is money in the fund. It's pretty straightforward. Simply makes sure that there is always money in the fund to provide for the State Patrol to continue to do what it needs to do with issuing concealed handgun permits, and that it never goes into the red. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kiel. Senator Schimek, to speak on the amendment.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Senator Kiel, I'm sorry, I was in a conversation here with Senator Janssen, and I did not hear what your amendment is. Could you tell me, please.

SENATOR KIEL: What the amendment does...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator?

SENATOR KIEL: Oh, yes. What the amendment does is simply require that the fund that will be established, in order to make the wheels go on the concealed weapons permit process, would need to be completely revenue neutral; and that, if the fund
