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opinion, but I do not think that this is an unreasonable amendment, and one that we need to have a clear discussion and make a clear decision. You could have a very large new operation go in outside of the watershed area and then allow that new operation to bring their waste back into the watershed area to apply, and that certainly isn't anything that I, personally, had wanted to see happen, and so I support the Beutler amendment and encourage you to ask questions. And I will continue to have conversations with Senator Schrock, but I think what I've said is correct, is it not, Senator Schrock, that without the Beutler amendment you could have a new facility outside the watershed and it would be up to the...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...DEQ to determine if you could bring that waste back in to the watershed area? They would have the ability to make that determination, is that true, Senator Schrock?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's correct.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct.

SENATOR BOHLKE: With this, we are saying we are not leaving that as a discretion to DEQ, but we're saying if we're about to protect the watershed area that that waste from those expanded facilities outside of the area should not be brought back in to the watershed. For that reason, I support the Beutler amendment.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. The next person to speak is Senator Schmitt, followed by Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Yes, Madam President, members, when I heard Senator Vrtiska talking a little bit ago on the other amendment and we were talking about DEQ, I guess they kind of got my attention. I want the body to know, and I guess I want this on record, and I was pretty supportive of the bill, but I think I'm going to support Senator Beutler on this amendment, because I
