explanations we've been given, namely, that DMV says this is just a cleanup, and I don't know what they're cleaning up. I don't know the need to have it cleaned up, and there might be matters that they refer to as cleanup that I would deem as being substantive, and that was why I think, and still do, that we need to divide this...these committee amendments. We need to get what is manageable before us. In trying to listen to the response that Senator Bromm gives to a question that is posed, I cannot continue to peruse the amendments themselves or his handout. I'm sure that once I get the key to what is being presented, it might all start to fall into place.
