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SENATOR JANSSEN: I know they have just recently put a new scale on...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...the Highway 77 expressway, north of Fremont. And I would, hopefully, I would hope anyway that they have...they have installed something in those newer...newer stations that they will be able to utilize this type of thing, because it looks like to me it would be a lot safer rather than those trucks pulling in and off of the...out of the scales. We're kind of getting away from...from this piece of legislation. But I think it does tie into...to some extent with that. And hopefully now the truckers, not the commercial carriers, but the farmers will not have to have the DOTs on their vehicles.

SENATOR BROMM: Right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right, thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Bromm a question or two.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm, would you respond?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bromm, has anybody brought to your attention any instances where these...these armed truck people that we're talking about, these...what do you call them? They work at the weigh stations.

SENATOR BROMM: Carrier Enforcement?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Carrier Enforcement, who want to be cops and commandos and SWAT Team members. Has anybody brought to your attention any examples of where they were confronted by a trucker and had to resort to this firearm, these sidearms?
