SENATOR CHAMBERS: Sure.

SENATOR BROMM: I mean I'll even give you time,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Sure.

SENATOR BROMM: ...if you run out. But impoundment or immobilization means removal of a motor vehicle from a repeat intoxicated driver's possession, or the rendering of a repeat intoxicated driver's motor vehicle inoperable. For purposes of this regulation, impoundment or immobilization also includes the forfeiture or confiscation of a repeat...this is going further than you asked me, but...repeat intoxicated driver's motor vehicle or the revocation or suspension of a repeat intoxicated driver's motor vehicle license plate or registration. So this language, removal, is coming from this regulation and I gave you my definition of removal, but that's the reason the word is there.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, but we're enacting state law now...

SENATOR BROMM: Correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and a person should go to the law and be able to understand what his or her duties are...

SENATOR BROMM: Yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and what consequences will flow from certain conduct. If the vehicle is to be removed, where is it to be taken to?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, that is a very good question, and I think the key, if we're going to comply with this language, is that it be removed from the repeat DWI offender's possession. It doesn't say and we haven't said where to, just that it be removed from their possession.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So this law is very incomplete. Even if we adopt this, it puts us in worse condition than we're in now,
