SENATOR HARTNETT: (Laugh) No, according to my counsel here.

SENATOR BROMM: It would not.

SENATOR HARTNETT: No.

SENATOR BROMM: All right, if the city had set a standard, we're going to all asphalt instead of...instead of concrete paving, why...and it was a two-block stretch or less, why couldn't they levy an assessment against me?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Senator Bromm, this is just to connect two portions of a streets that already done. That's what it's for.

SENATOR BROMM: But if the two streets that it was connecting had gone to asphalt, and mine was dilapidated concrete, could they replace my concrete with asphalt for that two blocks and assess that to me then?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Not if it's already been assessed.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay, not if it's already been assessed.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah.

SENATOR BROMM: Not if the previous construction of the street was assessed to me.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay, and that's in the existing statute.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah.

SENATOR BROMM: You're nodding your head.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: Is that yes?

SENATOR HARTNETT: That's, yeah, that's correct, Senator.
