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they get to use the system. But the second part that worries me the most is TANF, which I still call ADC, because that's welfare money and I don't want to lose any of that money. As far as I'm concerned, welfare reform, so-called welfare reform, is here. It is working pretty well in some ways and not in other ways. It's not perfect. I didn't vote for it. I still don't think that it was such a great idea, but I don't want to lose that money. So if I vote...if I don't vote for the bracket and I do vote for the bill, it's that part of the money that I'm thinking of more than, any other...any other money or any other reason. I have other...my district court clerk in Lancaster County was quoted in the newspaper saying she thought this was a good idea. The county attorney, as I understand, doesn't like the idea. So they're no help. You see, I have to make up my own mind. So, having said all that, I will say that probably I won't vote for bracket, but I'm going to continue to listen. But...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...stop and think, when I...when I'm saying what I do, is who's going to lose the money? If it's administrators, I don't worry about administrators. But if it's mothers with children and those children are not going to get welfare money and are...they get such huge sums of money, you know, like \$389 a month for a mother and two children. I don't think any of you could get along on that. But that's why I will support the bill, because I don't want them to lose money. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Further discussion? Senator Connealy.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you, Mr. President. My concerns with the bill are the same as a lot of others, but the reason that I went ahead and advanced it out of committee was that I think that we need to look at the ten-day turnaround. We need to keep that in mind, and we're holding kids' money. So wherever we end up on LB 637, I hope that the state continues to look at shortening that ten-day turnaround. And I'd yield my time to Senator Chambers.
