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don't have to speak on this issue again, so thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schmitt. Senator Jones, on the Kremer amendment to the Schimek amendment. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President and members of the body, I want to yield my time to Senator Bromm.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, you have almost five minutes.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Jones. I wonder if Senator Schimek would yield to a couple of questions, please, Mr. President.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: Mr. President, I'd like to ask Senator Schimek a couple questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek, would you yield?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, I will.

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Schimek, my first reaction on this amendment is that the date isn't too critical either way, but I wanted to ask you a couple questions about the beginning of the amendment...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Sure.

SENATOR BROMM: ...where it reads in a county which "has appointed a planning commission and is preparing or has adopted a comprehensive development plan," I just want to talk about those words. And if you've explained them, I apologize for "retrodding" the ground. But in a county which has appointed a planning commission, okay, that would simply mean that the county board would have to have gone through the mechanics of selecting and appointing five people, or whomever, to a planning commission. Is that...is that what would be intended?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That's my understanding.
