PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The motion is agreed to. Senator Wickersham, you're recognized to open on AM1281.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. President, just one other brief comment. This amendment will slightly increase the estimated fiscal impact of the bill but because, of course, this is an exemption from taxation, you won't see an A bill tagging along, but you will see a revised fiscal note at a later date. I think the current fiscal note estimates the bill would have a fiscal impact of about \$12,000 a year. That may go up to the range of 14 to 15 thousand dollars per year with the adoption of this amendment but that is not a hard and fast number. We've not yet received an estimate, a firm estimate from the Fiscal Office, but you should be advised that there will be a revised...this amendment will cause a revised fiscal note at a later date, but we don't expect the fiscal note to show an insupportable burden in terms of reduction of the state revenues.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. Discussion on AM1281. Senator Wickersham waives closing. The question is the adoption of AM1281 to LB 280. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Wickersham's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to. Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I'd move the advancement of LB 280 to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The question is the advancement of LB 280 to E & R for engrossment. Those in favor say aye. Those opposed nay. The bill is advanced. Members, while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LB 297, LB 432, LB 552, LB 68, LB 68A, LB 101, LB 194, LB 324, LB 475, LB 574, LB 141, LB 99, LB 469, LB 608, LB 674, LB 674A, and LB 43. Mr. Clerk, LB 774.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hartnett would move to
