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otherwise provided." Then when we get down to Cash Funds, it has the same language, "are hereby lapsed unless otherwise expressly provided." So, if we have "expressly provided" with reference to Cash Funds, I want "expressly provided" with reference to General Fund. This idea of saying, unless otherwise provided with General Funds but otherwise expressly provided with Cash Funds, means that there's a difference between the two, because the language is different. So I want to either put "expressly" up there with "General Funds", or I want to strike "expressly" from down here with Cash Funds. Then there are some other equally substantive amendments that I have. On page 1 in line 13, where they're talking about each agency how this act applies, I think it ought to apply to each specific agency, so that we pin this down because people who deal with appropriations are very precise people. And the process is extremely important. And the process is expressed by the language that we use. So it's going to be necessary for me to go through this budget bill with a fine-tooth comb and I am prepared to do that. And if you-all are willing to cooperate with me and adopt these amendments that you might think are inconsequential, we won't be here nearly as long on each individual amendment. But we're going to be here just as long, overall, unless circumstances change. But I don't see that I'm dealing with a Legislature that's of a mind to change. Here we are, like a herd of buffalo, just running fast, fast, fast. Then Senator Wickersham stands up and says, well, I'm not sure. Senator Wehrbein stands up and says, be cautious. Senator Don Pederson stands up and says, you promised. And all of the buffalo, the buffalo in front put on the brakes and stopped, then the rest of us go tumbling over them and are very embarrassed and humiliated, because three people stood up, uttered a word, and everything came to a halt. I just can't buy that. And I just don't think the Legislature ought to be so easily turned away from that which we were moving toward. Why, when I made that motion to bracket this bill so that people could work out that amendment with Fiscal staff, why didn't somebody stand up and, instead of helping me give them time by discussing the bracket motion, say this is nonsense, we're not going for this. We don't care what kind of amendment you draft, this is process, process is what counts. It was not said. All of the work was done. The delays were participated in. Then we are told, uh-uh,...
