SENATOR CUDABACK: The committee amendments are adopted to LB 873. We're now debating LB 873. Senator Wehrbein. Senator Wehrbein waives closing. The question before the body is, shall LB 873 be advanced to E & R Initial? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 38 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 873.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 873 is advanced to E & R Initial. Mr. Clerk, next agenda item.

CLERK: LB 876, a bill introduced by the Speaker at the request of the Governor. (Read title.) The bill was introduced January 27, referred to Appropriations. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein, you're recognized to open on LB 876.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President, members. This is a bill you may want to vote against. This allocates the salaries to the legislative body. You can do your own consideration on that. Maybe you don't want to vote against it. Maybe you'd like to have the salaries. This is that bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Jones on the advancement of 876.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President, members of the body, I'd like to...ask Senator Wehrbein a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein, do you yield?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR JONES: We'll follow your lead and let you vote first. If you vote red, we'll do that.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: (Laugh) Okay. You decided to dare me, huh?
