SENATOR BROWN: Yes.

SENATOR C. PETERSON: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Mr. Clerk, items for the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 870, LB 683, LB 816, LB 127, LB 538 to Select File. Judiciary Committee reports LB 527, LB 661, LB 865 to General File, two of those with committee amendments attached. LR 111, LR 112, study resolutions, will be referred to the Board. LR 113 is by Senator Price. That will be laid over. That's all that I had, Mr. President. (Legislative Journal pages 1937-1943.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. (Visitors introduced.) For further discussion on FA202 to the committee amendments to LB 105, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the body, I simply rise to support this particular section of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Further discussion on FA202 to the committee amendments to LB 105? Senator Beutler, recognized.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Hartnett or Senator Brown, if I could ask a question or two about this particular amendment, and I would direct your attention to lines 17 through 21 of page 3 of the amendment. I stated for you my general philosophic discomfort with this form of a subsidy and this form of a welfare program because it involves the ownership of assets as opposed to the giving to a particular individual in need of the resources necessary or providing them with the resources necessary to acquire the housing that they may need. It may be that at this juncture, at this point in time, certainly without the cooperation of the federal government, that there is no
