SENATOR LANDIS: No. And I'll tell you why. Remember, it says, unless a general policy is adopted by the governing board of...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...the governmental subdivision providing such services.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. Okay.

SENATOR LANDIS: Since that's the case, you'd have to have a taxing authority that was providing safety, rescue, emergency services, road or street construction. You couldn't reach in and have the school say, oh, and I want a payment in lieu of taxes as well...

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. Okay.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...because they're not on the list.

SENATOR VRTISKA: But then...I don't have much time left...but in fact, then, it would be bound by those things that you spelled out, and no other efforts. So in fact, what would be the percent of taxes they would actually be paying, in your estimation?

SENATOR LANDIS: Well, it's a proportionate share of...what they do is they take a look at their whole budget and they say, how much of it is composed of these things, and that's the amount that they would make into a payment in lieu of taxes...

SENATOR VRTISKA: So would it be different in...?

SENATOR LANDIS: ...unless they pick another method.

SENATOR VRTISKA: It would be different in different counties?

SENATOR LANDIS: It would depend on what the proportionate share in those counties were. And I could imagine...

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay.
