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SENATOR LANDIS: ...then, my goodness, there's much more to put in a library than zoning codes. I don't get it, something is going on and we're not hearing about it on the floor. I would like to know more, but given the justification that's there, we would do something different and far more extensive than this bill. My conspiracy theory is this makes it easy for mega hog operations to learn what the zoning codes are in the state of Nebraska for their planning purposes, to find out where they can come and where they're going to have difficulty for zoning, or, in the alternative, it's a way for one county to learn what another county is doing so they can adopt it to keep mega hog operations out. I don't know which it is, but I think it's one of those two things, otherwise I don't see what the purpose of this bill is. And we should either do it far more systematically or we shouldn't do it at all.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Yes, Mr. Speaker. Again, I'm just standing because I did vote to bring this out of committee. I had reservations at the time, I still have reservations at the time. And I'm probably not going to vote for it on the floor. I think Senator Landis has made some very good points. And I'm not sure, if you go out and talk to the counties out there, that they are all in favor of having this centrally located, because I think it will make some more work for them out there. So I just wanted to clarify that. If you're looking at your gadget, my name is on there of bringing it out of committee, which I agreed to do, but I also said at the time I wasn't sure I would support it, and I'm pretty sure I'm not going to support it for the same reason that Senator Landis is discussing here, I think he makes a very good point. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Kremer. Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. I was just going to have a few comments about what Senator Landis has been speaking about. I really feel that the centralized filing would be used more by each county than it would by mega hog operations. The mega hog operations still have to follow Title 130 and all the requirements they have from there. They don't have any problem finding out what counties
