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current information, and not on hearsay information, and that's what I...that's what I gather. Now maybe I'm wrong, maybe I'm right. I think that's what the reason for this is, a central point to go find information out rather than calling a hundred places, no, 93 places, whatever. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schmitt, followed by Senator Redfield, Bromm and Kremer.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. I guess I rise, I'm probably going to oppose this again, and I guess this is just my opinion and maybe it's pure speculation, but in the answer to Senator Landis' question, I think if you look at your gadget on your desk, you will see who the proponents of this bill were, and you will see who the opponents of this bill were. County Officials didn't support it. The cattlemen, Farm Bureau, Pork Producers, all supported it. Back when this bill was originally introduced, there was a lot of counties that were not zoned. Today, I believe there are six that are not zoned or haven't put in some type of proposal. I'm not sure today that this bill has the impact that it had when it was originally introduced by Senator Schellpeper. I feel at the time it was introduced, it was introduced for one reason, where the large corporate operations had easy access to a central location so they knew which counties were not zoned, weren't even dealing with the zoning, and they could go there and start their businesses. Again, I say this is my opinion, pure speculation, but I believe that is probably the answer to Senator Landis' question. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Redfield.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. Senator Landis I believe asked a very legitimate question. Senator Schimek gave us an answer. She said that this was public information and we were making it easier for people to get that information. I think that's accurate. But I think that the question that we haven't asked ourselves is, is that the function of state government? Do we want to make the Secretary State's Office a library for the entire state for every law, every zoning, every regulation that exists in this state? We know that there are organizations out there that
