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eyes are dilated and he appears to not be in good shape at all to drive, whereas if he has to prove that he is either under the influence of alcohol or drugs, it's probably an impossible burden. So under those cases, and I...I don't think that...I don't know how often it'll come up, but it won't be easy to prove, but it will allow the possibility of prosecution of those who have...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...an apparent...an apparent combination of drugs and alcohol that they are driving under, and if you stop and think about it, and we read the papers, we read the news, I really think this is probably more common than we would like to believe. And so I...I think Senator Pedersen's bill is a good bill. I don't think...I don't think that...the committee did look at it, I don't think we can put in a black and white standard like the .10, a threshold standard that would be helpful. If there would be one, I would be all for doing that, but that's...that's my take on the bill. Thank you, Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Pedersen, I recognize you for a...

SENATOR DW. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Senator. Madam President, members of the body, yes, this bill is good but it needs some work, and at this point, I don't think we have enough...enough time to go into it, so I'd like to pass over the bill for today.

SENATOR CROSBY: The motion is to pass over LB 864. Any objections? Seeing none, it is...the motion carries. (Visitors introduced.) Now, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 510 offered by Senator Chambers. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 15 of last year, at that time referred to the Government Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on LB 510.
