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Department estimates that a health program manager and a half-time secretary will be needed. An additional health educator may be needed in 2002. The health educator has not been included in the cost of this fiscal note. I just would have to say it looks like to me over two years this could be ultimately a half a million dollar cost. I'm not saying it may not be cost-effective. I'm just saying, as we move along over the next 30 days and into next year, these are the kind of costs that are increasing. It's going to have to come out of something other than our regular operating budget, but we have three choices to get the money. We reallocate...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. We are discussing the committee amendments to LB 950. Senator Hilgert, did you wish to speak on them?

SENATOR HILGERT: Senator Byars, would you yield to a question, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Do you yield, Senator Byars?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes, I would, Senator.

SENATOR HILGERT: Can you, I have been doing some other business, but have you talked about the actual procedures and the tests yet?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes.

SENATOR HILGERT: Okay, and you stressed the point that this is a noninvasive test?

SENATOR BYARS: Correct.

SENATOR HILGERT: Many Nebraskans have very strong concerns about different requirements, shots, immunizations, and so forth. And I just wanted to rise, not only to say I support this bill tremendously to make sure the point is driven home that this is a noninvasive procedure. There is not a downside, Chairman of the Appropriations notwithstanding (laughing) as far as the expense of the bill, but there is really no downside to this bill and no one should be fearful of the bill, and those
