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another hurdle known as Select File, and depending on how things develop, I may or may not have considerable to say at that stage, too. This morning I deviated from what I intended to do and that was to go through cases of specific judges who have been disciplined as a result of the efforts that I put forth to show how great the necessity is for those outside the system to do something because those inside will not. Some may feel they cannot. It is a tragedy of the greatest proportion when judges, who misbehave, are more fearful of one lone despised state senator than he is of all of his judicial colleagues, the Judicial Qualifications, or society at large because they all wink and nod and go along with it. Sometimes it's very difficult for me to listen to debate on the floor when people are in their very moral and righteous mode, and they are talking about defending this system or defending that system and how crucial it is to the welfare of the body politic and society, but then when we come to these issues that deal directly with the administration of justice and women, especially, being abused, those people are quiet and nothing is said, nothing. So although it is not my desire to be judgmental, there are times when within I can be nothing other than judgmental. When we have a good little ways to go in the rest of this session, there are other issues that will come before us, and because of the fact that there were and still are a couple of bills that relate to judges, their salaries or adding a judge, I will have the opportunity to discuss the types of things I'm talking about this morning without encumbering other bills unless, unless events unfold which put me into a different zone. I am going to support the advancement of this constitutional amendment and I will support it all the way across the board.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Brashear, there are no further lights on. Did you wish to close on advancement of LR 291CA?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Mr. President, very briefly. Members of the body, we've had a wide ranging discussion today. Having had that, I would just summarize that this bill will make it possible for judicial pay raises, which this body has approved, to take place across all of our judiciary at the same point in time instead of keeping what is, essentially, an anachronistic situation now where it can only take place within one court when
