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brothers and sisters to do something very real economically? Already, they're putting into corporations, nonprofit tribal corporations, proceeds from gambling and turning those into businesses and into ownership of apartments and commercial buildings and the things that will be permanent. The gambling probably will not be permanent, but are you willing to take away this tool and this opportunity from them...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...to make a merely symbolic statement? I think it's worth allowing the people to vote. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. President, members, I usually try to say what's on my mind and to me it's just simple. It's just simple in the fact that you would think this body was going to make the ultimate decision of whether we should have gambling or not. This body is not going to do anything of the such. This body simply is going to say that the people of Nebraska make that decision. You would think that we were, with all the contemplation and with all this goings on and all the ties in committee, that we were really going to make the final decision. We're not going to do that. I remember a person sitting in that chair right over there where Mr. Connealy is sitting now. He was so sure that this body would do the right thing, he was so sure this body would do the right thing that he made a...he put a motion up before they even debated his bill to kill it just to bring it to a head. He made a motion to kill his own bill. You know what? The body did. He didn't need that body. Killed his bill. He thought that, boy, I'm going to bring this to a head and bring it to a vote, the body is going to do the right thing. In his mind and my mind, the body didn't do the right thing. Was to some of them, I guess. All wanting to kill it, in their mind they did the right thing. That was...that was Senator Hall. I shouldn't say his name, but did anyhow. But this body is not going to do anything. Let the people decide this. What's wrong with that? What's wrong with that? Sure, you can't take every...you can't take every bill to the people. You can't do that. You probably can't take Senator Jones' bill,
