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mean that it's not going to the matter of what types of coverage take place but I'm not sure. It does talk about requirements, but I don't know whether it changes any type of coverage. What that does suggest is that the Banking Committee will require insurance companies to meet certain criteria which the Banking Committee, as a part of the Legislature, deems to be necessary in the interest of the public. Because of that, I wish that I could persuade the Banking Committee and Senator Jensen to put...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the label "technical" on some of the changes I would like to get in terms of insurance coverage in this state, but I don't think that would happen because the insurance companies would protest as they have done already. I think males may have fallen victim to some of my harsh criticisms of the committee last year for not covering certain things pertaining to women and contraception by refusing to deal with the matter of prostate cancer in men but I guess...well, my time is up. I will wait till the next time.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, speaking of prostate cancer, I am not sure how I would have voted on that bill because I don't know with precision what was in it, but it is one of those subjects that probably does bear some discussing and looking into. Even if the Legislature were not going to require coverage of that particular male ailment, there might have been the possibility of giving men some advice, some instruction and guidance on how to cope with such a condition if it happens to befall them, where to go to get the examinations, to help them overcome the shame and embarrassment that they might feel as a result of one of these examinations, learn the difference between what they call seeds or chemotherapy or surgery or simply nothing. And young men should take note while they are young, find a doctor in whom confidence is reposed and learn something about this condition prior to its striking. If there are preventative measures that can be taken, they ought to be. On this floor and
