good rule here, right? I mean it's what, 6 cents a page at Kinko's, if you do it yourself, or 10 cents a page at most, if they do it. That sounds fair to me. Breaking down the budget of a political subdivision for salaries, expenses, costs, whatever, seems a long way around the rabbit hole. And I mean,...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I agree with you.

SENATOR LANDIS: So, if we're talking about, look, this says essentially you get to...you're in the realm of reasonableness if you're talking Kinko's charges and you don't get to double, triple, quadruple or "tentruple" that kind of a charge and be regarded as reasonable.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: And you don't get any margin of profit, it's not a profit center.

SENATOR LANDIS: Okay. That helps.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Beutler, on the committee amendments to LB 628.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, Senator Brashear, if I could just have one more exchange with you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I...I really appreciate how sophisticated this particular amendment is and seems to be a big improvement. The line I wanted to ask you about was line 22 on page 3, and the preceding sentences that cause that to make sense. But it's the part that says that within three business days you have to comply with the request or, if you can't, then subsection (c) kicks in, which says if the entire request cannot be reasonably dah, dah, dah, dah, within three business days due to a significant difficulty or the extensiveness of a request, then you have to give a reasonable explanation that includes several items. And the last item is an opportunity for the requester to modify the request, I understand that. Now this is the part
