CLERK: Thank you, Mr. President. A hearing notice from Education Committee. LR 321, a resolution by Senator Coordsen. (Read by title for the first time.) Senator Robak, LR 322. (Read by title for the first time. Legislative Journal pages 1035-1036.)

Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend the committee amendments. (FA319, Legislative Journal page 1036.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers, recognized to open.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I would amend the committee amendment to strike "twenty-five" and insert "five". That would be \$5 million going into this so-called property tax relief fund. I was opposed to it last session. I'm opposed to it this session. I don't think that is a wise course to take. It is a highly political course and may make good press here and there, but when it comes to how we're going to spend the money I don't think it's wise at all. Before I proceed, I need to ask Senator Wehrbein a question or two from page 11 of the yellow publication.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, about, oh, maybe two-thirds of the way down is a notation for the State Patrol and it says Whiteclay expenses,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...\$147,000.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then, about six lines down, it talks about the Military Department, Whiteclay expenses--reallocate to Patrol, \$147,000.
