PRESIDENT MAURSTAD PRESIDING

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Good afternoon. Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. If members will report to the Chamber and record your presence, we'll begin this afternoon's business.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Do you have items for the record?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President. Your Committee on Government reports LB 1021 to General File with amendments. New A bill, LB 936A by Senator Matzke. (Read LB 936A by title for the first time.) And I have an amendment by Senator Thompson to LB 1399; Senator Smith, LB 1399. That's all that I have at this time, Mr. President. (Legislative Journal pages 1059-1065.)
