said it was going to. We have received more dollars, IGT dollars, than we ever thought that we would have. I think it is only proper that we go with now a third round in the conversion program and, again, Omaha, Lincoln, probably none of these dollars will go there. These will go to the smaller communities, those communities that have nursing homes that need or would like to convert to assisted living units. So what will happen is, in October of this year, if that's the exact date on when the IGT funds, the next round, would come in, I think that's somewhere in the 50-55 million dollar range. Fourteen million would be immediately transferred over to the Conversion Fund. With that, Mr. President, I'll close my remarks and be happy to answer any questions that anyone might have.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. We are now discussing the committee amendments to LB 1427. There were several lights on prior to this. I will ask if you wish to talk on the committee amendments or whether you did not wish to. Senator Bohlke. I do not see Senator Bohlke. Senator Schimek, did you wish to? She waives off. Senator Bohlke is not here. We're now discussing the committee amendments to LB 1427. There are no lights. Senator Jensen, did you wish to close? Senator Jensen waives closing on the committee amendments. The question before the body is, shall the committee amendments to LB 1427 be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The committee amendments are adopted to LB 1427. We are now open for discussion on the bill to advance to E & R Initial. Senator Beutler, on the advancement.
