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professional people. I know one young woman in particular, I know her and her family, she was blinded in an accident when she was still in college, and she went on and finished her degree at Wesleyan, I'm sure it was Wesleyan. Her mother went to classes with her to take notes and so on, so she could survive. She's married, has a family, does very well. So my point is that this particular deprivation from people of their senses, this particular thing isn't quite so devastating sometimes as some other things, because they can...they are still highly intelligent and can overcome the problem of not being able to see. So I just beg of you, as I said, I guess I'll support the Jensen amendment, because if you go for the sunset I don't want it to...at least it will go to 2003. A lot of people have asked me what I'm going to do when I leave the Legislature. Well, I see one little job for me right now, I'm going to help this commission survive, that's what I will do. So I will help...I will hope, and if I have to come down and ask somebody to introduce a bill to get rid of the sunset, if we get the sunset. I'll do that. So you won't get rid of me so easily, so why don't you pass this bill for me and maybe I won't bother you so much. Thank you. (Laughter)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN PRESIDING

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President members of the body. I think what we need to do is establish in our minds the differences in the kinds of commissions we're talking about. The kinds of boards and commissions that the Government Committee has been looking at have really been the kinds of boards and commissions who have probably limited purpose. They...they are the kinds of boards and commissions that you establish to accomplish a certain goal and then probably they are easily then gotten rid of or sunsetted. This kind of a commission is really different from a lot of the kinds of boards and commissions that we've talked about on this floor and in committee. And it is...it really becomes a separate agency. And it is in my mind very difficult for...to think that an agency could get up and running and then all of a sudden, bingo, it's gone, it's automatically sunsetted, there's no provision for any review or any...anything like that. I don't think
