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this bill, can have that adequate time to respond, we give the custodian of the public record leverage, as I call it. We give them something to say I cannot do this as fast...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...as you want it, now you need to come to us, the requester needs to come to the custodian and work out a reasonably acceptable methodology and process for getting the public record as fast as the requester wants it; for instance, bring in a temporary photocopy machine, provide the personnel to run the copies through, provide the personnel to help maintain the files in good order in accordance with the requirements of the custodian. So I think it's a well-balanced act. With that, I would yield my time back to Senator Bruning. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bruning, there's about a half a minute left.

SENATOR BRUNING: And I'd yield my time to the Chair. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bruning and Senator Brashear. Senator Matzke, on advancement of LB 628.

SENATOR MATZKE: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I previously visited with Senator Brashear about the issue that I wish to raise and I am going to do essentially what Senator Bruning was attempting to do, and that is to build a legislative record on how this bill will be interpreted. And I want to give you a true hypothetical case. This morning I talked to the county treasurer of the county in which I live and she advised me that she had received a request from Texas for every record in the county treasurer's office, a record of every real estate description, the names and addresses of every owner of real estate in our county, the assessed valuation, and the tax. Now in Cheyenne County, that is 11,000 tax parcels. The requester did not furnish any information as to how all of this information was going to be used. They insisted that it not be hard copy, that it be on a floppy disk, and our county treasurer's office is not equipped to supply a floppy disk. Now in the initial amendment that I looked at, it said that the
