SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. The question before the body is, shall AM2906, offered by Senator Beutler, be adopted to LB 171? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk. Record vote has been requested.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 1220.) 26 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on the Beutler amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Beutler amendment, AM2906, has been adopted to LB 171. We're now debating the bill itself. Senator Chambers.

CLERK: I have another amendment, Senator.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Oh, excuse me, there is another amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have, Senator Beutler, your AM2912 in front of me. In that case, Mr. President,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: ...I have nothing further on the bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Nothing else? Yeah. Yeah. Now we are debating the advancement of LB 171 to E & R for engrossing. Senator Chambers, on advancement.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I will speak one time and I would like a roll call vote when we vote, because I want everybody on record, especially some of my Omaha colleagues who cannot get consideration for their poor constituents, but they will vote to give this break to these big shots, and I'm making it clear why I want this record. I'm not pretending that it's for any reason other than to show where people's priorities really lie, because I've seen other votes. And I will make comparisons. If Senator Schimek hadn't voted aye belatedly, Senator Beutler would have been the 25th vote, and Senator
