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raise your hands. And Governor Owen (phonetic) said that...I mean the Governor said this is exactly what the rural economy needs. That \$30 million went into the rural economy. Now you're all up here fighting over chicken feed, and it's really not even chicken feed. Chickens couldn't even have a good living off this bill. But they know that and it's proved by the fact that chicken growers cannot qualify under it because there's not even chicken feed. Those who sell chicken dinners though cannot either, Senator Bourne. I just don't understand my rural colleagues, and I use that term advisedly because I do understand at a deeper level. But if I'm going to beg, if I'm reduced to the point where I must beg and I have no choice, I'm going to beg for something so that when I have to look at my scraped up knees, the holes in my trousers, worn there by crawling and graveling and begging, then I at least have something to show for it. I've lost all my dignity. That's gone. But, as people would say, you can't make soup out of dignity. But it's not quite as hard to be hungry with dignity than it is to be hungry without it. You're going to still be hungry and you've lost your dignity over something like this. Who could take great pride in a bill like this...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...who would take it out and explain to their constituents how little it is going to do? And they come up to you and say, is this going to stop people from leaving the farm and the rural area? Well, no. Is it going to save those businesses that have closed on main street? No. Is it going to make a loan available to me that I couldn't otherwise get? No. Well, how am I going to get anything? Well, you have to invest so much money and make so much money, then you get a break on some kind of corporate tax. And they say, I don't even know what you're talking about.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So this bill will not be discussed in detail. Maybe the number will be given. Maybe a copy of a bill or some paper that can stand for the bill when a speech is being given, this is what I did for the rural community, and you hope that they don't ask you any specific questions, because the answers
