SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So it's intended to be all volun...where is the training money, is that going to be some federal grants or other grants?

SENATOR SUTTLE: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So it's all volunteer, even after it gets off and there is no need for administrators and...

SENATOR SUTTLE: That is correct.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm being a little careful because many times those come back and bite us a little bit. Well, I'll reserve judgment and I'd like to hear the discussion on it. I wanted to make comments on the committee amendments, Senator Thompson's bill, but I'll wait for that till after this amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Wickersham on the Suttle amendment.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. President, members of the body, if you recall, a year ago Senator Suttle offered an amendment to another bill and it dealt with this subject matter, and I expressed a number of concerns about this kind of a program. I expressed the concern that even though now it is staffed by volunteers, and even though it does not now cost us any money, and even though somebody will tell you that it will never cost us any money, ultimately these programs need administration, ultimately these programs, because they claim, rightly or wrongly, that they are benefitting the state of Nebraska, they will claim something and, for right or wrong, we will eventually be asked to contribute state resources to support this program sometime after it is started up. That was one concern. The other concern I had with the proposal, and I still have with the proposal, as it is presented to you in an amendment, is that what we actually have in some cases is persons engaged in the unauthorized practice of law. Now that's a serious issue no matter in what context it arises, but I, as a lawyer, have to be concerned about that as it arises in the context of juvenile proceedings, and I'm not content to say that I think a judge
