simply establish a road map, a road map that will help us to find the procedural and substantive process that will result in good redistricting for the state. Senator Coordsen outlined the preparations that have already been made technically, to handle the technical aspects of this process, with the computerization, the software, having people ready to and already in place, and that, I think, is excellent. But I think, by having the road map now, we can minimize intensely potentially political fights that could occur on this floor. And by involving the public I do think, Senator Schimek, that we do lessen our chances of litigation, because when people are surprised, and there is no rational explanation, they are more apt to file lawsuits or have a knee-jerk reaction. I don't think we'll have that if we follow this process. Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I would ask for your support.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. You've heard the closing on LR 494. The question before the body is, shall LR 494 be adopted? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on LR 494. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of LR 494.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LR 494 is adopted. Mr. Clerk, items for the record?

CLERK: Mr. President, a reminder, there will be a meeting of the Executive Board at noon today, in Room 2102. Senator Brashear has an amendment to LB 971 to be printed. New resolution (read LR 501 by title for the first time), that will be laid over. Bills read on Final Reading, Mr. President, were presented to the Governor at 11:40 a.m. (re LB 26, LB 26A, LB 349, LB 495, LB 495A, LB 825, LB 825A, LB 901, LB 901A, LB 956, LB 1003, LB 1003A, LB 1004, LB 1008, LB 1008A, LB 1010, LB 1067, LB 1086, LB 1167, LB 1167A, LB 1200, LB 1221, LB 1234, LB 1234A, LB 1251 and LB 1304). The constitutional amendment, LR 6, was presented to the Secretary of State at 11:45 a.m. And a second resolution (read LR 502 by title for the first time), that likewise will be laid over, Mr. President.
