ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Byars would move to withdraw LB 187.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Byars.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and colleagues. We found that LB 187, which would have appropriated funds from the General Fund for respite services, unnecessary as we are looking into other avenues other than the General Fund for funding for the necessary respite services. So I would ask your leave to withdraw LB 187.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. There are no lights on. Did you wish to say anything in closing? The question before the body then is the withdrawal of LB 187. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to withdraw the bill.

SENATOR COORDSEN: LB 187 is withdrawn. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, the next item, LB 163A by Senator Cudaback. (Read title.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. President and members...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Cudaback, to open on your bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. President and members, this is simply the A bill that goes along with LB 163 with the Correctional Services that was passed here a couple weeks ago. Fiscal Office thought this was a better way of doing it than subtracting it from the amount that was left over, funds that weren't used. There were several million dollars. But in order to keep a track record of what's going on, Mr. Calvert and...thought that this was a better way of doing it, so this simply puts in the maximum amount that could be used by the counties if it was drawn on...for the parolees that are sent back to prison. Thank
