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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Quandahl. You've been very forthright. And I think what you see is how little thought has gone into this bill. There is no certainty that we'll get to Senator Quandahl's amendment. There is no certainty that it will be adopted. But what is certain is that this was a poorly drafted bill. It was not well-thought-out and, even when we reach the point of the committee amendment, which is what we're talking about, where they had a chance to get a second bite of the apple, there still are things in the bill that the introducer has no idea what they mean. Now, what is Senator Vrtiska to tell one of his colleagues or his constituents who would call him about that? The introducer was asked questions about what a word in his bill means and he says he doesn't know. So if the question to Senator Vrtiska then becomes, how can you vote for a bill like that, Senator Vrtiska? I'd like to ask Senator Vrtiska a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Vrtiska, to a question?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes, I will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Vrtiska, I'm not going to ask you to explain what the words "signs" mean because the introducer does not know, but if some of your constituents saw that exchange and the introducer admitted he doesn't know what this word means, how broad it could be and what it would include, and your constituent asked you, why are you going to vote for a bill with stuff in it that the one whose bill it is doesn't even understand, how would you justify voting for it to your constituent?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, Senator, the only thing that I, you know, as I've listened to this debate this morning, and I appreciate the fact that we're getting debate, but as I've listened to this what I have started out with was the idea that we were in the process of trying to protect young people from overindulging in alcohol and I would assume that that's what this bill is about. My constituents who called me and wrote me, told me that they believe that we needed to take some measures to encourage young people to not drink and drive, and so that's
