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believe you've also looked at, and I would assume that you'll take the lead on that. But I've looked at it and I don't have a problem with that. Mr. President, with that, I would yield my remaining time back to the Chair, or yield it to Senator Chambers so he can be recognized.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Speaker Kristensen. Mr. Clerk. Senator Chambers, it's your intent to withdraw the current amendment and substitute this amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's correct, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Amendment is withdrawn. Without objection, we'll substitute. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on the substituted amendment. (FA235, Legislative Journal page 1850.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this should go much more rapidly than things have on this amendment earlier because it reduces it to the language that Senator Kristensen had mentioned where we're going to wind up saying that the company will use a program to further the workplace safety of employees. That is the sense of the amendment. I hope that you will adopt it. And, as Senator Kristensen pointed out, he and I have looked at it, worked it over. This is what we've come to as an agreement. I think the assertion is clear, forthright and there is no question as to what it means. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Members of the body, I would urge the adoption of this particular amendment. And there are certainly other things we can find to debate. This is one we're going to agree to, and it works, and would hope you'd vote for it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close. Senator Chambers waives closing. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment
