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you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion, Senator Bromm, followed by Senators Chambers and Suttle. I'm sorry, Senator. I'm sorry. Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Chambers, as you were describing Senator Brashear's sliding and gliding about the hallways (laughter), I soon began to realize who you were talking about, but I do always remember when I talk with Senator Brashear because it's a memorable experience, so...but I...I do know who you were talking about was Senator Brashear. I want to say that, as I became interested in this bill, it became more obvious to me that certainly the DNA testing options that are set out in this bill are absolutely good legislation. I don't think any...any prosecutor wants to...any prosecutor, worth his salt, wants to feel that he has the wrong person incarcerated and certainly behind bars for their life or for a great period of time or facing the death penalty, and so I certainly support that. There have been some parts of the legislation that I've had some questions about. Senator Chambers has been very, very gracious in discussing those areas and I think there may even be some areas that we won't get dealt with in this particular legislation that we will discuss later, perhaps to work on through the interim. But this particular amendment I think is a suitable mechanism for finding a place to fund these tests and that's what this does. It creates a process by which the Commission on Public Advocacy can receive and disburse the money where the testing is approved and where it is necessary and where the person is indigent or has no way to...to pay for this themselves. I would...I should have probably done a bit of research on this, but I would ask Senator Chambers if he would yield to a question with...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will, O one who bludgeoned me into submission and slides around the hall inconspicuously.

SENATOR BROMM: (Laugh) You have finally gotten to the age
