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first started, I talked to Senator Bromm at much greater length and what I'm willing to do, no matter how strong a position I have articulated, no matter how firmly entrenched that position is in my mind, if it's a serious enough issue for me to think about and deliberate on, if I see a reason to change my mind and alter my position, that is what I will do. This is a bill that I've spent a lot of time on even during the summer. While we are in session Senator Brashear and I have had I don't know how many discussions. He has done a lot of work with reference to this bill. His staff has done a lot of work. Many people have contributed to it. So, such being the case, even though my name is on it, that does not give me a right to just brush aside all of this hard work and the valid arguments that people had presented. So, though you all may not believe it, I listen when people on the other side speak, and on this particular case the other side prevailed and I changed my mind. And I have to acknowledge in the full light of day in front of everybody that I have, once again, it doesn't happen often, been bludgeoned into total absolute surrender in detail. But I do believe in the process the bill is better. I think the system we followed in arriving at the point where we are now has been valuable. I think it is in keeping with proper legislating because we have covered every aspect of the bill I can think of. I believe Senator Bromm has had the opportunity, and has availed himself of it, to discuss any and every aspect of the bill he thought needed to be addressed. Senator Brashear has done the same up to now. This is his amendment and by the time he is finished I'm sure he will have gotten everything into the record he thinks needs to be there. If no questions are put to me I am not going to extend the debate much further.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I, personally, cannot think of more things that I need to say, but I'm willing to answer any additional questions that might exist. In concluding on this part of my presentation, I'm expressing my support for Senator Brashear's amendment.
