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concerned about making sure the projects ahead of them get done. I don't think it's pri...a rearranging of the order of priorities at all. I think that was good fodder for a speech by Senator Hilgert, but I don't know that that's particularly accurate. What I thought I heard was that they don't need the planning money, because they can find it somewhere else. I'm as concerned about them finding that, Senator Thompson, more than you are, because I'm going to wait longer than you're going to wait. But you've waited longer than others have waited to get to this point. So if there's a juggling of the priorities, then there's a genuine concern you ought to have here, absolutely. If it's a matter that they can find money somewhere else, then I think it's not a real good precedent for the Legislature to stand up and say, well, we're going to give the university more money than they ask for. That's not a particularly good message to be sending. And so I will agree with Senator Wehrbein that we should vote no on this particular motion to override, and then move into where there really are some disagreements, I think genuine disagreements. I think UNO has the support, clearly, at least of the University of Nebraska at Kearney, to get those projects done. It's in our best interest to make sure your projects get done quickly, because then the list moves, and those of us that are lower down the list move up as well. And they would like to...Kearney would love to jump ahead of some of those projects. And they've been told, not only by the university, but their local senator, that you don't do that. You sit and you wait. And so I would want to urge my support of my colleagues from UNO. But let's don't give them more than they ask for. I think that's a bad message. I plan to vote no. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Senator Brashear, followed by Senator Thompson on the motion to override.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, thank you. Members of the body. I turned on my light because I wanted to rise in support and total agreement of what Senator Thompson said earlier on the record. Total agreement between Senator Thompson and I is something devoutly to be wished in the last 24 hours. And I want to echo everything she said about the distinction of the
