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That's what the amendment is that I'm offering now. I have three items that I'm dealing with. We could figure how many amendments I can offer by seeing how many combinations I could get. I could go after SSAP alone, I could go after SAP alone, I've gone after PEAP alone, now I'm going after SSAP and PEAP. I could then go after SSAP and SS...and SAP, then I could go after SAP and PEAP. So I have other amendment combinations I can bring to continue discussing this bad item. Senator Vrtiska, I'd like to ask you a question because you seem...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to be paying attention.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Vrtiska, I'm not going to be offended by your answer. Are you growing weary of hearing me speak this afternoon?

SENATOR VRTISKA: No, I'm not getting weary. In fact, I wanted to ask you a few questions as soon as you get through with this...this round as...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, are you going to put your light on?

SENATOR VRTISKA: I'm going to put my light on.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Good. Then I will engage you in that discussion when the time comes. Members of the Legislature, I can't ask Senator Vrtiska now the question I was going to ask because he and I are going to talk. I'm going to ask Senator Schimek a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek, would you yield to a question, please?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schimek, are you growing tired of hearing me speak today?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, because, Senator, I haven't been in here
