SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...hemisphere did not come into existence when Europeans stumbled into it. It always was here. Yet, they're given credit for discovering things that were here from time immemorial. So if that which is already in existence can be discovered and a person be given credit for the discovery, if an employee discovers something that ought to be done and which, if done, will save the state money, why not grant to the employee what the employee and every other employee was led to expect would take place? I wanted to use this bill, once Senator Coordsen pointed out what it is, because my remarks may not be pertinent to any other bill, and what I'm saying in no way detracts from what this bill is about.
